



## V8 Autumn Tour 2011

The Norton Park Hotel at Sutton Scotney east of Winchester was an ideal base for the annual V8 tour with a programme of events which took quiet routes through Hampshire, Berkshire and the eastern edge of Wiltshire. On Saturday one route went via Inkpen Beacon, a northern fronting bastion of the Berkshire Downs, once seen as the only "mountain" that topped 1,000ft in south eastern England. But it now seems this high

point is in fact "only" 975ft but the landscape around Inkpen offers dramatic views of sweeping hills and big skies – truly wonderful on the fine day the V8 party were there. In the distance is Combe Gibet, originally erected in 1676 – with Pete Teager's V8 on the chalk track.
