V8 Cambridgeshire Tour Friday 10th to Monday 13th September 2010

The planning for the V8 Cambridgeshire Tour 2010 is well advanced with several exciting events already firmed up.

- The Imperial War Museum, Duxford has put our visit, on the Monday, into their events programme for 2010 and we have special gate entry arrangements and parking in a group by the runway.
- Our visit to Sidney Sussex College, where Oliver Cromwell was an undergraduate, is scheduled for the Saturday morning and Cambridgshire County Council has kindly provided us with free parking near the centre of Cambridge for the whole morning; a major coup!
- A visit to and tour of the National Stud has been arranged and we should see many famous racehorses there and the crop of yearlings, though the foals, which are there now, will have gone.
- We visit Ely Cathedral as it towers over the Fens and we have a chance to see the unique Stained Glass Museum as well as the stunning design of the Great Central Lantern.
- The great house at Audley End, built in the 1600s is in the Sunday Programme and we can visit the recently refurbished Stable Block as well as the House itself and the Service Wing; a unique insight into life "below stairs" in a great house.
- We tour the Cambridgeshire fens and visit the main water management centre at Denver Sluice where all the ground water from the Midlands and East Anglia is controlled as it gathers and flows out to the Wash. We will also see the fenland old steam pumping engine at Stretham as well as Wicken Fen, a noted fen wildlife reserve.
