

"We want to cut petrol costs by at least 30p a gallon..."

That's the message from Kent Transmissions Limited who will launch the Costello five-speed gearbox later this year to do just that.

Designer Ken Costello explains: "We've developed a gearbox which reduces the stress found in conventional gearbox casings. This means it can be manufactured from a thin, light aluminium alloy which in itself conserves fuel.

"As well, the use of a fifth gear means a 10 to 20 per cent reduction in fuel consumption—that's a saving of around 30p a gallon."

Savings are also achieved with the use of a light grade oil, possible because of its low running temperature, and the simplified design allows for low maintenance, increased efficiency.

Fortunately the Costello gearbox is so flexible it can be fitted to a wide range of rear-wheel drive vehicles, from the smallest car to a 30cwt van—a boon for the small commercial vehicle operator.

This adaptability is arranged by a variety of bellhousings. Different tail housing arrangements make it possible to have a variety of gear change positions without having to change the existing gear lever position in the vehicle.

Driving a car fitted with the new Costello gearbox will be a pleasure too. A redesigned, improved gearbox selector mechanism provides a very smooth, precise and satisfying gear change.


The Costello five-speed gearbox is the brainchild of Ken Costello, who more than 10 years ago converted a standard MGB and powered it with a 3.5 litre V8 Rover engine—to the acclaim of motoring writers.

Costello designed the new gearbox as an alternative to an overdrive facility and because of the demand for a "cruising gear" in road vehicles.

"It's difficult to find a four-speed gearbox which completely covers the full range of driving conditions and is easy to use. And people are becoming increasingly aware of the greater fuel efficiency of a five-speed gearbox."

When will this revolutionary, new style gearbox be available? Prototypes have already been made and tested by leading motor manufacturers and Kent Transmissions plan to release the first few thousand by the end of this year.


