Books account for £210.30 of the income, this coming from the sale of Barrie's notes and the RV8 Story Book

There were four donations from members during the 2021 year amounting to £64.19. The difference of £500 was a personal loan from J Cumming to ensure that the bank account remained positive.

The sale of Key Ring Fobs & Barrie's Notes via the Club Shop amounted to £56.00. Sales via the V8 Register website of Face Masks, RV8 & V8 Notes, MGB Notes, Notes Up-date Subscriptions, V8 Mugs, Grill Badges, V8 Windscreen Badges and Adverts for the sale of cars amounted to £1,019.00 giving a total of £1,075

Expenditure £135

The purchase of regalia stock during the year amounted to £135.49. Deducting the £135.49 from the income leaves a profit of £940.00

Sponsorship £400

Two amounts of money were given: one from Clive Wheatley and the other from Brown & Gammons to sponsor the Kent Tour. This reduced the event loss to Nil.

Other Items £5,683

Repayment of Solicitor's fees by the Main Club that were incurred sorting out the problems at Kimber House during February 2021.

**Administration Expenditure** 

Bank Charges £201

Worldpay commission and transmission charges were £200.95. Following the sale of Worldpay to a US investor we found in the third quarter of2021 that the charges from Worldpay (particularly their monthly fees) increased substantially to a level where they were a burden for a small trading entity like ours. So we have moved from Worldpay to another online payment services provider, Stripe, who has a much lower level of transaction fees.

Adding the surplus, £48, to the brought forward of £7,666 gives a surplus of £7,713 to forward to the balance sheet.

The operating surplus has reduced from £624 in 2021 to £47 in 2021.

Cash at the Bank has increased from £6,801 to £6,888 and increase of £87.

The majority of the income is generated via the V8 Register website operated by Victor Smith who continues to spend a great deal of time operating and managing the system. On behalf of the V8 Register may I say thank you for all you hard work and dedication to the V8 Register and Club.

## Sales via the V8 Register shop amounted to £1,252

The main items sold were:

Web and Internet costs were £537 and Worldpay costs were £476 that's 38% of the sales. This Worldpay figure is far too high and was the justified reason for Victor to move to **Stripe** who have very low deductions compared to Worldpay.
