Many MGBTV8s have had an interesting life and Malcolm Nicholls' car is no exception. It was built in April 1974 and despatched to Wadham and Stringer in Chichester as Citron 1616 and priced at £2,294 soon attracted a buyer in Buckinghamshire. Two years

later it was traded to a garage in Twickenham and sold on to a new owner who lived near Marble Arch in London's West End who kept it for another 2 years. In 1980 it was sold again and was in Peckham in SE London before the owner moved to Brentford Dock opposite Kew Gardens. In 1982 it was acquired by a new owner in Wimbledon but he sold it only 5 months later and it went to Slough.

Then it was bought by a gentleman who lived in Solihull who later moved to Grantham in Lincolnshire where it remained for 8 years. In 1994 it was

sold and went to Ramsgate in Kent.

By 2005 it was looking somewhat shabby and was rescued by a Director of a local company who wanted it as his company car. The V8 was sent to Maidstone Sports Cars for a complete refurbishment and a colour change to British Racing Green. It was sold on again and at the end of 2008 was with Fishers MG Garage in Sydenham in SE London. Luckily it was spotted by the current owner, Malcolm Nicholls, who says "we have since been all over the country in it to various MG events and even to France and Belgium.

Alongside, the V8 is coming through Broadwell Ford on the Cotswold Caper" in 2013. It's enjoying life and has a good home now.
