Why doesn't the boot open via the dashboard switch?

A brief but useful reminder from Peter Garton was posted on the V8 Bulletin Board in May saying "for the life of me I could not get the boot to open remotely via the dashboard switch. I tried via the ignition, plus the switch, but nothing worked, so I got out the last resort action - the handbook! There I saw to my indignation that I did not have the handbrake on! See page 82, Owner's Handbook AKM7144ENG.

I park up in my garage with the car in first gear only and simply forgot that one has to engage the handbrake plus have the ignition on plus pressing the boot release switch. Must be getting old!

The handbook says Luggage compartment release switch - press to open luggage compartment. Only operates

with the starter switch in position
"II" and handbrake on. "
